



#### Our 35-year History – a Story to Celebrate!

In 1986 Lawrence Bryan and friends founded SICMS so that South Bay audiences could enjoy a quality professional chamber music concert series here in San Jose. All concerts were presented in First Unitarian Church downtown until 1993, when our audience outgrew the rotunda's capacity. From 1994, all of our concerts were held in the delightful 318-seat Trianon Theatre—until May 2019 when Trianon was sold and ceased being a concert hall. For 2019-20 we relocated our series close by to the Concert Hall at the San Jose State University School of Music and Dance, until Covid closed the campus. We now invite you to enjoy our concerts in our resonant new home in Willow Glen—St. Francis Episcopal Church, at 1205 Pine Avenue, at Newport, San Jose.

#### OUR VENUE

#### LOCATION, TIME, PARKING & CONCERT PROTOCOL

We welcome you to our accessible venue for the 22-23 season, St. Francis Episcopal Church, in the Willow Glen area of San Jose, at 1205 Pine Avenue, corner Newport Avenue—with VTA bus stop. Pine



Avenue intersects Lincoln Avenue, which connects with CA 87 via Curtner Avenue. Pine Avenue, as Hamilton, intersects Hwy. 17.

This sanctuary has lively acoustics, 244 comfortable, wide seats, and a superior 9'2" Bechstein concert grand piano.

#### All concerts start at 7:00pm.

The church has 20 on-site parking spaces—including 16 regular and four Handicapped—accessed via a one-way alley entered from Pine Avenue, and exiting onto Newport Avenue. Audience parking, is primarily on the neighborhood streets.

No food or beverages are allowed inside the church.

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#### 7:00 PM - SAT. OCTOBER 15, 2022

**Trio con Brio Copenhagen** (Denmark) piano trio returns Playing Beethoven, Prokofiev, & Shostakovich



**Program:** BEETHOVEN Piano Trio in E-flat Major, Op.70/No.2 (1808); PROKOFIEV Suite from 10 Pieces from *Romeo and Juliet*, Op.75 (1937), arr. by Trio con Brio Copenhagen; SHOSTAKOVICH Piano Trio No.2 in E Minor, Op.67 (1944).

Music: Beethoven's Trio is "relaxed, even-keeled, benificent,..." and freshly expressive. • As Prokofiev sought, his ballet score tells Shakespeare's love story in music "immediately appealing yet sounding like nothing written before." • Shostakovich's 1944 Trio is a haunting elegy to the loss of a close friend and is his lament for the victims of the Holocaust, news of which deeply affected Shostakovich.

Artists: Trio con Brio Copenhagen (combining two sisters, and a cellist-pianist marriage) are in great demand as worldwide touring artists. Formed in 1999, and soon winning piano trio competitions, the Trio is now acknowledged one of the finest in the world. Their Shostakovich & Arensky CD won the 2022 German Record Critic's Award. "Unforgettable playing." (BBC Music magazine). "We can now see the con Brio as the worthy successors of the legendary Beaux Arts Trio." (Diapason).

#### 7:00 PM - SAT. FEBRUARY 11, 2023

Van Kuijk String Quartet (France) & Sean Shibe (UK) guitar Mendelssohn, Boccherini, Adès, de Falla, Poulenc, & Castelnuovo-Tedesco



Program: MENDELSSOHN String Quartet in F Minor, Op.80 (1847); BOCCHERINI Guitar Quintet No.4 in D Major, G.448 (1798), "Fandango"; Three guitar solos: ADÈS Habanera (2015); de FALLA Homenaje: Le Tombeau de Claude Debussy (1921); POULENC Sarabande; CASTELNUOVO-TEDESCO Guitar Quintet, Op.143 (1950).

Music: Mendelssohn's impassioned Quartet is his emotional elegy for his sister Fanny's death. • Boccherini's "Fandango" Quintet closes with the lively Spanish dance! • Shibe's solos are gems: a dance from an Adès opera; de Falla's tribute to Debussy; and Poulenc's hauntingly beautiful Sarabande • Meeting Segovia inspired Castelnuovo-Tedesco to write nearly 100 works for guitar.

Artists: Van Kuijk's international accolades include 2015 Wigmore Hall Competition 1st prize-winners and European Concert Hall Rising Stars. "Style, energy and a sense of risk. These four young Frenchmen made the music smile." (The Guardian). • Grammy-winning Scottish guitarist Sean Shibe performs worldwide: UK/Europe, China, USA. "the most interesting voice on the guitar for a generation" (Gramophone Awards Issue).

**Ensemble San Francisco** (Bay Area) as piano quartet Playing Beethoven, Brahms, Shostakovich, & two new works



Program: Solbong KIM From the Sixth Hour for Piano Quartet (2005); BEETHOVEN Sonata for cello & piano No.4 in C Minor, Op.102/No.1 (1815); SHOSTAKOVICH Five Pieces for Two Violins and Piano (arr. 1970 by Lev Atovmyan); Polina NAZAYKINSKAYA Songs for Tasya (2021); BRAHMS Piano Quartet No.1 in G Minor, Op.25, Gypsy Rondo (1861).

Music: Kim "speaks a musical language that is modern yet non-doctrinal." (The Korea Times). • Beethoven's "late" Op.102/No.1, subtitled "Free Sonata," is fantasy-like. • Shostakovich's Five Pieces—Prelude, Gavotte, Elegy, Waltz, Polka—are delightful. • Nazaykinskaya's Songs for Tasya is a dark lullaby and an anthem of courage. • Brahms' marvelous and expansive quartet thrills with its wild "Gypsy Style" ending. #### 7:00 PM - **SAT.** MARCH 11, 2023

**Esmé String Quartet** (South Korea, based in Germany) Wigmore Hall winners play beloved Borodin & Tchaikovsky Quartets



**Program:** BORODIN Quartet No.2 in D Major (1881); György LIGETI Quartet No.1, "Métamorphoses nocturnes" (1953-54); TCHAIKOVSKY Quartet No.1 in D Major, Op.11 (1871).

Music: Borodin's 2nd Quartet, composed as an anniversary love letter to his wife, is full of deservedly loved music. • Ligeti's Quartet, with Bartók-inspired tone and rhythms, in 12 short segments interestingly transforms its major 2nd intervals. • Tchaikovsky's folk-flavored 1st Quartet, the first great Russian string quartet before Borodin, is famed for its poignant, beloved Andante cantabile 2nd mymt.

Artists: The Esmé Quartet, since winning first and four special prizes at the 2018 prestigious Wigmore Hall Competition (London), is touring to international acclaim. Based in Germany, the group was formed in 2016 at the Hochschule für Musik in Cologne by four South Koreans who have long been friends. "(They) play with depth and maturity..." (Suddeutsche Zeitung). "lyricism and airy limpidity,...profoundity and unexpected allure." 5 stars. (Diapason).

#### 7:00 PM - SUN. JANUARY 29, 2023

The renewed **Pražák String Quartet** (Prague) returns Audience favorites play Haydn, Schulboff, & Schubert



**Program:** HAYDN String Quartet in G Major, Op.77, No.1 (1799); Erwin SCHULHOFF "Five Pieces for String Quartet" (1924); SCHUBERT String Quartet in D Minor, D.810, (1824), "Death and the Maiden".

Music: Haydn's Op.77 final complete quartets masterfully blend thematic, chordal and contrapuntal part-writing with new heights of expressiveness, and sophisticated use of folk melodies. • Czech Erwin Schullhoff's Five Pieces are a suite of dances: Viennese Waltz, Serenade, Czech folk music, Tango, and Tarantella. • Schubert's lyrical, dramatic Quartet No.14 draws on his song "Der Tod und das Mädchen" (1817).

Artists: Welcome the Pražák's fifth appearance here—an audience favorite ensemble now renewed by two new Czech members. Since its founding in 1972 at Prague Conservatory, the Pražák's acclaimed musicianship has brought to world attention the unique Czech string quartet tradition. The "engaging" and "superb foursome" (Chicago Tribune) has toured worldwide for 30+ years, and released 50+ award-winning CDs on Praga/Harmonia Mundi. "Poetic...powerful performance" (LA Times).

**Delphi Piano Trio** (Bay Area) – "**Music, She Wrote**" Fanny Mendelssohn, Clara Schumann, Lili Boulanger, Gabriela Frank



Program: Music, She Wrote: Lili BOULANGER D'un matin de printemps [Of a spring morning] (1917); Clara Wieck SCHUMANN Piano Trio in G Minor, Op.17 (1846); Gabriela Lena FRANK Four Folk Songs for Piano Trio (2012); Fanny HENSEL (née Mendelssohn) Piano Trio in D Minor, Op.11 (1846).

Music: Celebrate music by women! Revelatory music by two well-known musicians of the Romantic era, Fanny Mendelssohn Hensel, Felix's talented sister, and Clara Wieck Schumann, known as 'Queen of the Piano.' • Lili Boulanger's masterful tone poem has expressive depth. • Contemporary California composer Gabriela Lena Frank's lively and colorful Folk Songs draw inspiration from her mother's homeland, Peru.

Artists: Praised for "spot-on ensemble playing and a beautifully-blended sound" (SF Classical Voice), the **Delphi Trio** of Bay Area stars has performed widely in Europe, Canada, and the U.S., and has become a powerfully eloquent voice. Their debut album, *Triptych*, won Gramophone's praise, and their world premieres are acclaimed. "Rich committed string tone, dazzling pianism, rhythmic flexibility" (Sarasota Herald Tribune).
